DIRECTORS' REPORT

Your Company posted promising results in the half-year and second quarter ended December 31, 2013 with considerable growth in sales as well as profitability.

Sales turnover further progressed during the half-year and second quarter with increase of 14% and 12% respectively over the similar periods of last year. Similarly sale volumes also increased by 6% in half-year and 9% in the second quarter. Soap noodle was the major contributor in this growth.

The Company continued its focus on increasing efficiencies and reducing costs. Consequently the increase in cost of sales in the half-year was only 9% viz-a-viz the increase of 14% in sales. As a result, the Company demonstrated phenomenal growth of 46% in gross profit in the half-year. The gross profit ratio to net sales increased to 17.9% during the half-year, which was 14.0% in the same period of the last year. Likewise gross profit in the second quarter increased by 37% with ratio to net sales of 18.0% (last year: 14.6%). Similar upsurge has also been witnessed in the bottom line; net profit in half-year is Rs. 97 million (last year: Rs.41 million) and Rs. 56 million in the second quarter (last year: Rs. 29 million). EPS for the half-year increased to Rs.0.88 per share.

We feel pleasure in reporting that as of the date of reporting these interim financial statements, major part of the plant and machinery required for the expansion of the plant has arrived at our plant and is being installed on fast track basis. In view of the current circumstances, the management is confident to commission the new production facility by the end of the current financial year.

The production in second half of the current financial year would be partly affected by the expansion activities to connect the new complex with existing infrastructure. We will, however, endeavor to lessen the impact on profitability and would continue to post encouraging results, Insha Allah.

AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS ON REVIEW OF INTERIM FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying condensed interim balance sheet of Nimir Industrial Chemicals Limited as at December 31, 2013 and the related condensed interim profit and loss account, condensed interim cash flow statement, condensed interim statement of changes in equity and notes to the accounts for the six-month period then ended (here-in-after referred to as the "interim financial information"). Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of this interim financial information in accordance with approved accounting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on this interim financial information based on our review.

Scope of Review

A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim financial information is not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with approved accounting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting.

NOTES TO THE CONDENSED INTERIM FINANCIAL INFORMATION - UNAUDITED FOR THE SIX MONTHS ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2013

THE COMPANY AND ITS OPERATIONS

Nimir Industrial Chemicals Limited ("the Company) was incorporated in Pakistan on February 6, 1994 as a public limited Company under the Companies Ordinance, 1984. The shares of the Company are quoted on Karachi and Lahore Stock Exchanges. The Company started its commercal operation on January 1, 2000. The registered office of the Company is situated at 14.8 Km., Sheikhupura- Faisalabad Road, Bhikhi, District Sheikhupura, Pakistan. The Company is engaged in manufacturing and sale of industrial chemical products.

BASIS OF PREPARATION

- This interim financial information of the Company for the six month period ended December 31, 2013 has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the International Accounting Standard 34 - Interim Financial Reporting and provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Ordinance, 1984. In case where requirements differ, the provisions of or directives issued under the Companies Ordinance, 1984 have been followed.
- The interim financial information does not include all the information and disclosures required in the annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the financial statements of the Company for the year ended June 30, 2013.
- This interim financial information is unaudited but subject to limited scope review by the auditors.Quarterly figures were not subject to limited scope review by the auditors as the scope of the review covered only the cumulative figures for the six month period ended December 31, 2013.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies and the method of computation adopted in the preparation of this interim financial information are the same as those applied in preparation of financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2013 except as follows:

New, amended and revised standards and interpretation of IFRSs

The Company has adopted the following amended IFRS and related interpertations which became effective during the period:

- IAS 19 Employee Benefit (Revised)
- IFRS 7 Financial Instruments: Disclosures amendements enhancing disclosures about offsetting of financial assets and financial liabilities.

Improvements to Accounting Standards Issued by the IASB

- IAS 1 Presentation of financial statements Clarification of the requirements for comparative information.
- IAS 16 Property, Plant and Equipment Clarification of servicing equipment.
- IAS 32 Financial Instruments: Presentation Tax effects of distribution to holders of equity
- IAS 34 Interim Financial Reporting Interim financial reporting and segment information for total assets and liabilities.

The adoption of the above amendments, revisions, improvements to accounting standards and interpretations did not have any effect on the condensed interim financial information except for as described in note 3.2

Change in accounting policy

During the period, the Compnay has adopted Revised IAS 19-'Employee Benefits'. As per revised standard, acturial gains and losses for defined benefit plans are recognized in the other comprehensive income when they occur. Amounts recorded in the profit and loss account are limited to current and past service costs, gains or lossed on settlements and net interest income (expense). All other charges in the net defined benefit asset (liability) are recgnized in the other comprehensive income with no subsequent recyling to profit and loss account.

The adoption of above revised standard has resulted in change in accounting policy of the Company related to recognition of acturial gains and losses to recognize acturial gains and losses in total in other comprehensive income in the period in which they occur. Previously, acturial gains and losses over and above the corridor limit were amortized in the profit and loss account over the expected remianing working lives of the employees as allowed under the relevant provison of previous IAS 19. Further, any past service cost (vested and non-vested) is now recognized immediately in the profit and loss account upon changes in the benefit plans. Previously, only vested past service cost was recognized immediately in profit and loss account and non vested cost was amortised to profit and loss account over the vesting period. The impact of the said changes on this condensed interim financial information is as under:

CONSOLIDATION OF SHARES

During the period, the Company consolidated its shares by increasing the face value from Rs. 5 per share to Rs.10 per share pursuant to special resolution passed by the members at Annual General Meeting held on October 29, 2013.

Authorized capital:

As a result of above consolidation, the number of shares in authorized capital reduced from 290,000,000 shares of Rs.5 per share as of December 31, 2013 (June 30, 2013: 290,000,000 shares) to 145,000,000 shares of Rs.10 per share.

Issued, subscribed and paid up capital:

The above consolidation also caused the reduction in number of shares issued, subscribed and paid-up capital from 221,181,093 shares of Rs.5 per share as of December 31, 2013 (June 30, 2013: 221,181,093 shares) to 110,590,546 shares of Rs.10 per share. One remaining share arising from the overall consolidation of shares has been cancelled from the shareholding of Nimir Resources (Pvt) Limited, the parent company in accordance with the special resolution.

During the period, the Company has obtained term finance facility from financial institution carrying mark-up at the rate of 3 month KIBOR plus 225 bps per annum repayable in 48 monthly installments with grace period of one year. This facility is secrued against first pari passu hypothecation and mortgage charge over present and future moveables and immovable fixed assets of the Company.

SHORT TERM BORROWINGS - Secured

The aggregate facility of short term finances from commercial bank available at period end is Rs. 990 million (June 30, 2013: Rs. 990 million). The rate of mark up ranges from 1 month KIBOR + 30 bps per annum to 3 months and 6 months KIBOR \pm 250 bps per annum with no floor and no cap (June 30, 2013: The rate of mark up ranges from 1 month KIBOR + 30 bps per annum to 3 months and 6 months KIBOR + 250 bps per annum with floor and no cap. These facilities are secured against 1st parri passu charge on the present and future, current and fixed assets of the company, including land along with construction there on and easements, amenities therewith.

The unutilized facility for opening letters of credit and bank guarantees as at December 31, 2013 amounts to Rs. 531 million (June 30, 2013: Rs. 167 million) and Rs. 53 million (June 30, 2013: Rs. 63 million) respectively.

8 CONTINGENCIES AND COMMITMENTS

There is no material change in contingencies since the last audited published financial statements, however the Company has made commitments in respect of letters of credit established for the import of raw materials, spare parts and machinery amounting to Rs. 309 million (June 30, 2013: Rs. 61 million) and commitments in respect of letter of guarantee given to SNGPL amounting to Rs. 76.7 million (June 30, 2013: Rs. 76.7 million) and letter of guarantees given to Customs amounting to Rs. 70 million (June 30, 2013: Rs. 60 million).
